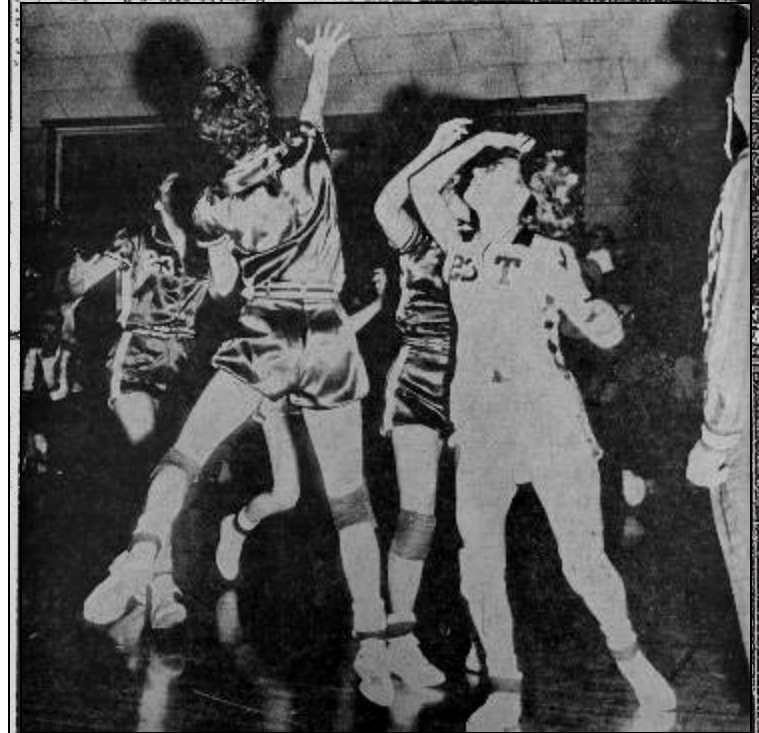

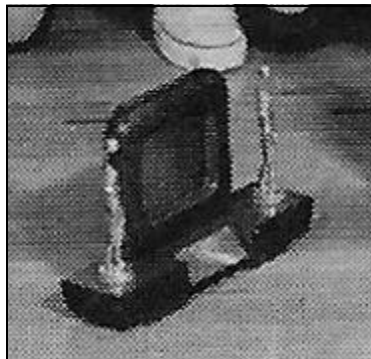

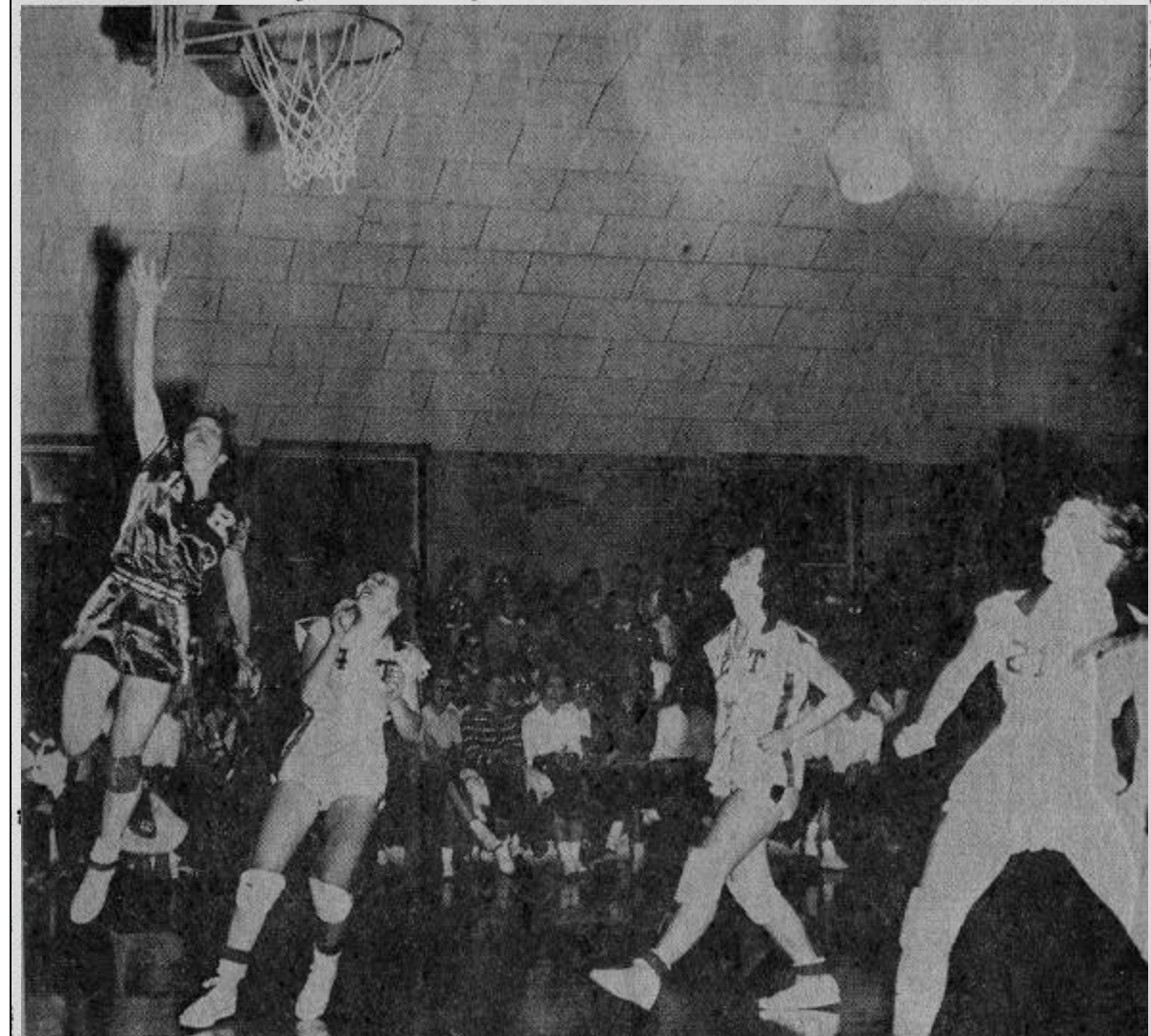

Rembrandt Girls One of Three Undefeated Teams

The Rembrandt girls' basketball team finds itself in a rather unique position as they prepare to take on Titonka in the semi-finals of the Pocahontas district tournament tonight.

The Raiderettes are one of three undefeated girls' teams left in the state, having swept aside 23 consecutive opponents.

This in itself is unique, but one of the other two unbeaten teams is in the same district tournament, Meriden. The only other unbeaten team left in the state is mighty West Central of Maynard, last year's state runners-up.

Rembrandt, although it has a stout defense, has been known as an offensive team all season. They have rolled up 1,299 points in 23 games for an average of nearly 57 points a game.

One of the top forwards in the state, Rosalyn Green, graces the Raiderettes' front court. Green has scored nearly half of Rembrandt's points this season, poking home 613 markers, an average of 27 points a game.

Green, in addition to her superb scoring, is a brilliant playmaker and team player. She passes off to her teammates whenever the opportunity presents itself. The best way to describe Green is to say she plays like a boy—a good boy.

Rembrandt has a tough sister combination in post forward Kay Hoover and post guard Sharon Hoover. Both girls are topnotch ball players.

Kay is the top rebounder in the front court and, in addition, she has scored 329 points. She is a senior. Sharon, a sophomore, is the standout for the Raiderettes on defense.

Rounding out the front-court is Eloise Mosho, a girl that could be the top scorer on most other teams. She has been high for the Raiderettes frequently, but with the balanced forward court it's hard to find a standout. Mosho has scored 357 points in 23 outings.

In addition to Sharon Hoover, coach Ken Hulsebus has three other top-flight guards in Betty Fovall, Sally Green and Sharon Breckenfelder. The Rembrandt defensive court is a young one that has shown steady improvement all season.

Last year Rembrandt ran into a hot Albert City sextet in the semi-finals of the sectional tournament and lost, although they scored 76 points. Albert City won, 92-76.

In addition to the sectional title this year, the Raiderettes tucked the Buena Vista county championship under their belts.

The Rembrandt six is a fast-moving crew, but this doesn't just happen. Hulsebus makes his girls run 40 times up and down the floor before he starts his practices.

Hulsebus is in his third year of coaching and his second year at Rembrandt. Previously he coached at Brooke.

A six minute period without a basket late in the game cost Rembrandt its six point lead and the game in the state girls semi-finals at Pocahontas Thursday night. The previously undefeated Raiderettes were leading Titonka 54-48 with only six minutes left to play when they suddenly lost their touch and finally lost 61 to 56.

Obman Scores Well

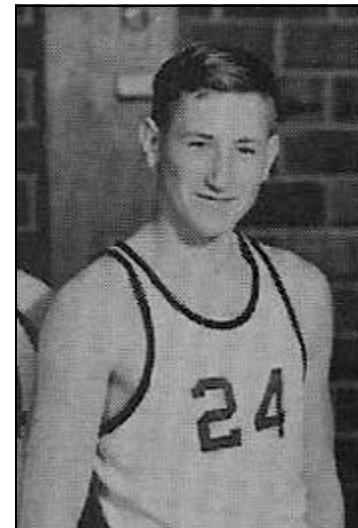
