Teams of this area to play at Aurelia consist of Brooke who will meet Marcus at 6:30 Monday and Fairview meeting Larrabee at 7:45.


Rembrandt Splits Games At Havelock Friday Evening

Rembrandt, although it has a tout defense, has been known s an offensive team all season. hey have rolled up 1.299 points 23 games for an average of arly 57 points a game.

One of the top forwards in the state, Rosalyn Green, graces the Raiderettes' front court. Green has scored nearly half of Rembrandt's points this season, pokng home 613 markers, an average of 27 points a game.

Green, in addition to her superb scoring, is a brilliant playmaker and team player. She passes off to her teammates whenever the opportunity presents itself. The best way to describe Green is to say she plays like a boy-a good boy.

Rembrandt has a tough sister combination in post forward Kay_Hoover and post guard Sharon Hoover. Both girls are Topnotch ball. players.






